

RESOLUTION NO. 16R-2541

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF SARASOTA, FLORIDA AMENDING THE BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2015 BY PROVIDING FOR SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS IN THE AMOUNTS IDENTIFIED IN EXHIBIT A; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY IF ANY OF THE PARTS HEREOF ARE DECLARED INVALID; PROVIDING FOR READING BY TITLE ONLY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 15R-2515 the City has adopted a budget for the fiscal year beginning on October 1, 2015 and ending on September 30, 2016; and

WHEREAS, the City needs to amend said budget so as to provide for supplemental appropriations in the amounts identified in Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, Section 166.241 (4) (c) Florida Statutes requires such a budget amendment be adopted in the same manner as the original budget.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF SARASOTA, FLORIDA:

Section 1. The budget for the fiscal year commencing October 1, 2015 is hereby amended by providing for supplemental appropriations in the amounts identified in Exhibit A.

Section 2. Should any section, sentence, clause, part or provision of this Resolution be declared invalid or unenforceable, by a court of competent jurisdiction, the same shall not affect the validity of this Resolution as a whole, or any part hereof other than the part declared to be invalid. Said provision declared to be invalid shall be deemed severed from the remaining provisions of this Resolution.

Section 3. Resolutions or parts of Resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 4. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.

ADOPTED by the City Commission of the City of Sarasota, upon reading by title only, after posting on the bulletin board at City Hall for at least three (3) days prior to adoption, as provided by Article IV, Section 2 of the Charter of the City of Sarasota, this 7th day of December, 2015.

Subject: Request for Budget Amendment from the Law Enforcement Trust Fund
for the Education Foundation of Sarasota County (Fund 110-070-000-000804-000000)

The Education Foundation of Sarasota County's Texcellence program provides under-served students with access to technology and training to foster academic enrichment, classroom success and digital literacy skills to prepare for 21st century college and careers. Since its inception in 2007, Texcellene has impacted over 24,000 students and families through its Home Computer Program and Digital Learning Labs.

In an effort to join forces with local organizations and community members to bridge the digital divide among high potential students and low-opportunity environments, the idea of Hackathon was born. "Hackathon" is a 48-hour event where 50-60 students join together with 150 mentors to create an app, game, or website that solves a community-wide issue.

A theme reflecting the Community-specific issue is chosen for the event and made known to the participants (high school age students who qualify, financially). Those participating students are grouped with a Technologist (like a programmer, developer, computer science student or grad), an Artist, and an Innovator (educator, business professional, or problem solver) to collaborate and create an app to solve the issue.

Through this hands-on, accelerated learning experience, underserved students gain fundamental skills needed to succeed in today's classrooms and beyond. Students are exposed to the field of computer science as a potential career, form meaningful relationships with other students, mentors, and the community to help break down race, gender, and access barriers.

Sarasota Police Department supports Crime Prevention through challenging education experiences such as "Hackathon", as a proactive and positive approach to fighting drugs and protecting the youth of this City. For this reason, a donation of \$10,100 from State Law Enforcement Trust Funds for "Hackathon" **to be used specifically for the portion of the program that will be utilized by High Schools within the City of Sarasota.**

Further, as required by law, I certify to you that this request complies with the requirements of Florida Statute 932.7055 (5) (a) through (c).
